



## **ANNOUNCEMENT: Citizen Potawatomi Nation to offer families SafeAssured's high-tech family safety program.**

The Potawatomi Citizen Nation is pleased to announce their recent purchase of a SafeAssured ID system and 500 ID kits. The system has been delivered and training in the simple setup and enrollment process will take place on July 25th. The department plans to schedule numerous ID events in the near future. Tracy Haney, Juvenile Justice Program Director for the Citizen Potawatomi Nation, was instrumental in coordinating the funding and purchase of the SafeAssured Program. After attending a demonstration of the system at the National Indian Child Welfare Association Conference, he commented: "This much-needed technology is impressive. It's reassuring to know SafeAssured ID kits provide important safety tips for parents and caretakers and combine this with digital information that law enforcement officers can utilize in a missing person case. We plan to offer the IDs at events throughout the Potawatomi Nation. Our children are our heritage and I want to do my best to protect them."

SafeAssured ID is the most comprehensive family safety program available to aid in the search for a missing person. The SafeAssured initiative allows the Citizen Potawatomi Nation to reinforce their commitment to serve and protect families in the Citizen Potawatomi Nation. The ID kits provide families with the power to immediately deliver comprehensive and ready-to-broadcast information unique to the missing person to media outlets and law enforcement agencies. In addition to common program benefits such as a digital photo and personal information profile, SafeAssured's kit also includes: 10 digital fingerprints, voice recording clip, and streaming video demonstrating unique mannerisms and movement. Private information is securely stored on an encrypted mini-CD ROM, accessible only to authorized law enforcement officials. The mini-CD allows the user to make missing person posters with a high-quality image. Families also receive a full-color photo data card and a preventative safety tips guidebook, written in conjunction with the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC). Personal information is stored only on the mini-CD, not in a database, to prevent unauthorized access to the information.
